NASHVILLE AUTHOR'S FOURTH BOOK NOMINATED FOR 2008 EPPIE AWARD.

Antioch, TN, resident Marie-Nicole Ryan's fourth book has been nominated as a finalist for a 2008 EPPIE in the category of erotic romance/contemporary/mystery/suspense. *Too Good To Be True* (\$15.00, Samhain Publishing, Ltd. ISBN: 978599986487), was based on a real-life 2002 Tennessee incident in which a newly elected sheriff was murdered in his own driveway.

Ms. Ryan says, "The EPPIE is awarded each year by Electronically Published Internet Connection, EPIC, a professional organization for published and contracted e-book and print authors. It was established to provide a strong voice for electronic publishing. While this award is for the electronic version, the book is also available in trade paperback."

Ms. Ryan is a long-time member of Romance Writers of America®, Music City Romance Writers, Kiss of Death, the RWA Mystery/Suspense chapter, and EPIC. She served two years as the editor of MCRW's newsletter from 2005 to 2007. She's a native of Henderson, KY, but she's lived in Tennessee so long she almost considers herself a native Tennessean. A full-time writer, Ryan retired from her day job as a case manager at Centennial Medical Center last fall.
